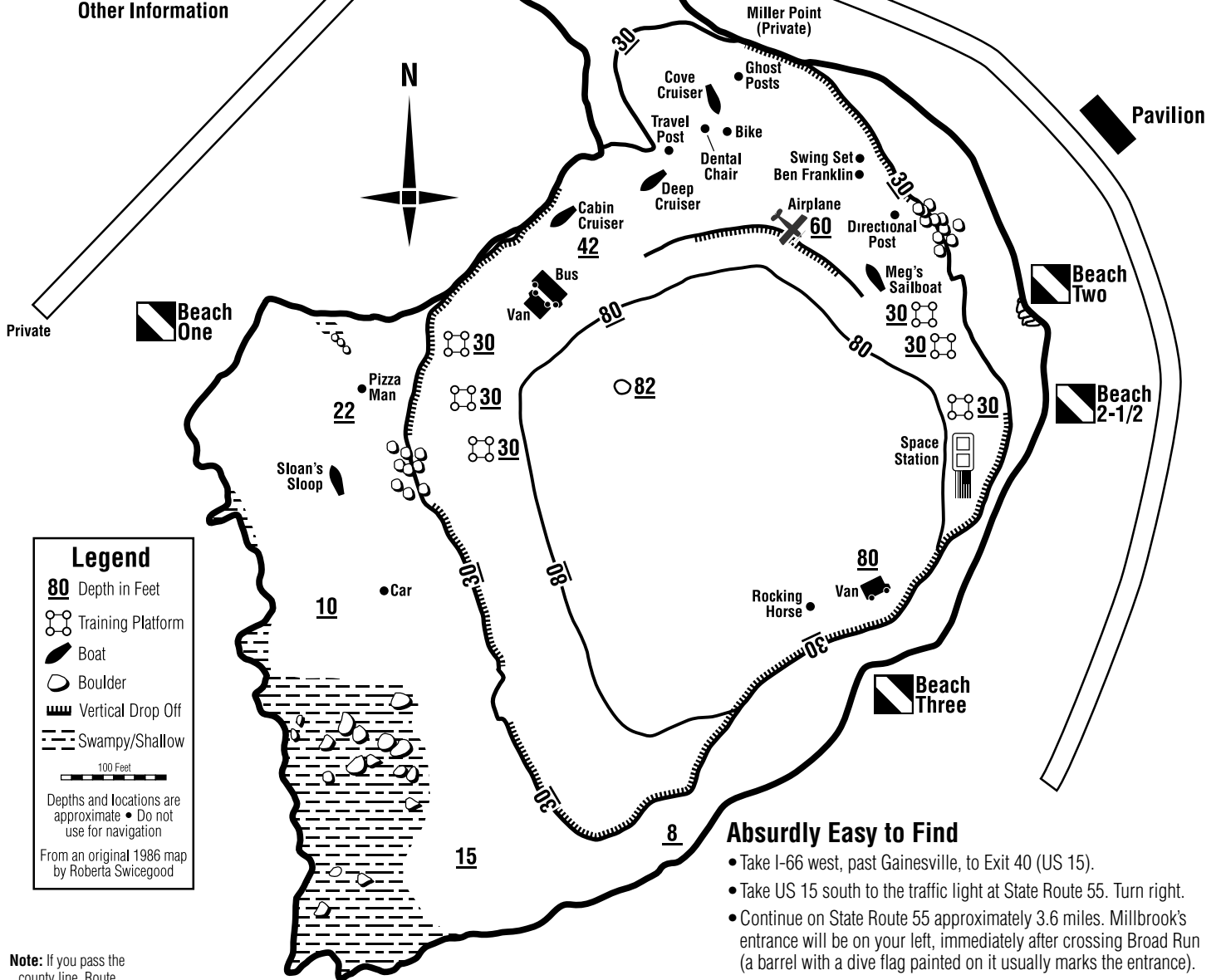

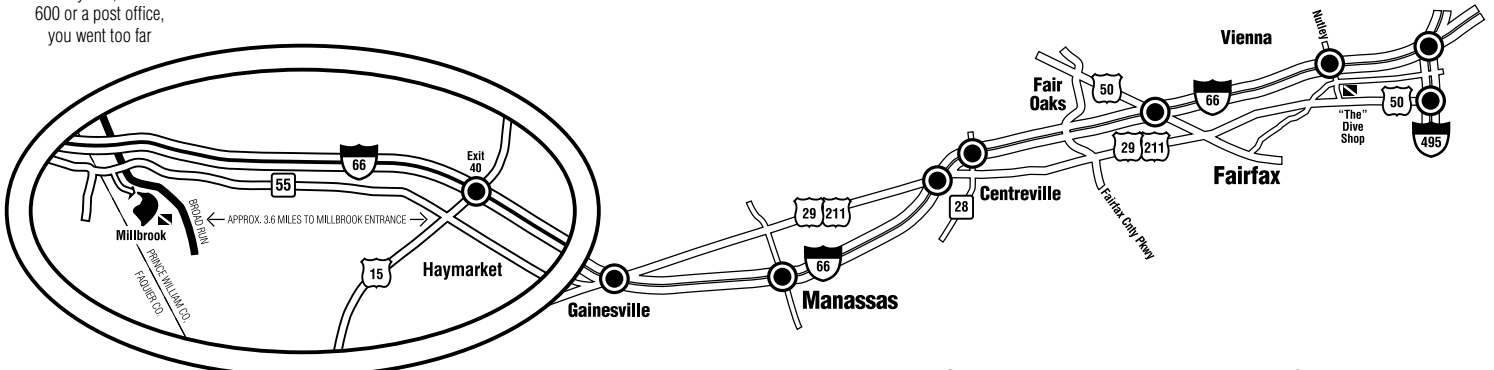

Absurdly Easy to Find

- Take I-66 west, past Gainesville, to Exit 40 (US 15).
- Take US 15 south to the traffic light at State Route 55. Turn right.
- Continue on State Route 55 approximately 3.6 miles. Millbrook's entrance will be on your left, immediately after crossing Broad Run (a barrel with a dive flag painted on it usually marks the entrance).



Diving the Lake at Millbrook: Important Rules

1. All visitors must stop at the gate when entering.
 - a. *Certified Divers and Continuing Education Students*: Present your admission pass, *completely filled in*, and your certification card.
 - b. *Instructors*: Before arriving at Millbrook, *you must have all of the necessary paperwork on file at "The" Dive Shop*, including proof of current liability insurance, proof of teaching/supervisory status with a recognized agency and sponsoring retail facility affiliation. Upon arriving at Millbrook, present the gate attendant with your current Instructor pass and a list of your *entry-level* students (no roster is needed for continuing education students). Let the attendant know where you will be. We will direct students to you as they arrive.
 - c. *Entry-Level Students*: Present your admission pass, *completely filled in*, and tell us who your instructor is. We will direct you to him or her.
2. Drive slowly; raise no dust. *You speed, you leave* — no exceptions. Divers have the right of way (and may not be able to hear you with hoods on).
3. All in-water activities, whether diving, swimming or snorkeling, require *a minimum of two participants*. The only exception to this rule exists in the case of certified solo divers who have filled out the necessary liability release and use the equipment required by standards.
4. Divers are expected to *wear and use equipment that meets current standards of practice*, including BCs, pressure gauges and alternate air sources.
5. No pets. No fireworks. *No exceptions*.
6. No *jumping off cliffs, rocks or barrels* (and no climbing on barrels — okay?).
7. Respect the rights of others by keeping noise levels to a minimum. *This means no portable air compressors*.
8. Fires are allowed, when not in violation of temporary restrictions on open-air burning. *Bring your own firewood, use fire rings and extinguish your fire completely before leaving*.
9. Admission passes are \$20/person for visitors age six and up (\$10/person if purchased beforehand at "The" Dive Shop). Children five and under are no charge; however, a responsible adult must still fill out an admission pass on their behalf. *Passes are valid until the last day noted on the pass and are non-refundable*.
10. Hours of operation:
 - a. *Saturday*: Normal operating hours are from 8:00 AM until 6:00 PM. No further admission allowed after 4:00 PM. Do not enter the water after 4:30 PM if you intend to leave by 6:00 PM.
 - b. *Saturday Night*: The gate re-opens for departing night divers from 9:30 until 10:30 PM.
 - c. *Saturday Night Camping*: Begins after Memorial Day weekend and ends Labor Day weekend. Camping is \$5/person; the attendant will collect Sunday's admission pass Saturday evening.
 - d. *Sunday*: Normal operating hours are from 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM. No further admission allowed after 3:00 PM. Do not enter the water after 3:30 PM.
